Following the funeral there are often some immediate concerns and questions. We put this brochure together to answer some of the more common questions you may have.

Death Certificate and Funeral Account

Your Funeral Director will register the death of your loved one on the day of the funeral.

The New Zealand Death Certificate along with the funeral account, will be sent out to the person at the address nominated when the funeral authority form was signed. These are posted around 7—10 days after the funeral.

Ashes

Your loved one's ashes will be available to collect from the Kapiti Coast Funeral Home office approximately three days after the funeral (sooner by arrangement). We are happy for you to leave them with us for a month or so, however after two months we follow up to ensure they are not left here indefinitely. There are many options for the final placement of ashes and a brochure titled;

Acknowledgement Cards

Bereavement Support

Financial Assistance

There are two main forms of financial assistance from the government, following a funeral, ACC and WINZ



The ACC grant is for death by accident only. The Death Certificate and Funeral Account need to accompany this application. Your Funeral Director can assist with filling in this application with you.

The WINZ grant is for persons with funds less than the total funeral invoice and the financial threshold and conditions and amount of the grant change annually.



If you wish to apply for a funeral grant, the necessary forms can be obtained from the funeral home or from WINZ.

We can assist you with filling this in.

When applying for a funeral grant you need:

- 1. The Death Certificate (see Death Certificate information earlier in this brochure)
- The Funeral Account
- The deceased's Benefit or Superannuation number; bank books; and Community Services Card.
- 4. Your Benefit or Superannuation number, bank account number and tax number.
- Identification—The applicant needs to take identification along, e.g. Birth Certificate, Marriage Certificate, Driver Licence or Passport.
